
Meanwhile, please also take some time to enjoy seeing the progression demonstrated below across these three different subject areas.

In KS1, pupils were able to explain their thoughts and feelings about this poignant poem.




Here are our little Otters in action:




After super discussion, they even produced this fantastic poem collectively!

OUR HISTORY PROGRESSION -

At KS1, pupils could show how they recognised that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.







At KS2, pupils went a step further and found similarities with the war times and compared it with their lives today!

All pupils were then able to put these recent Historical events on their classroom timelines.

OUR ART PROGRESSION—

Every pupil in the school was set the task to paint and make a poppy out of a plastic bottle for our whole school War Memorial display.

At Key Stage 1, our Otters showed they could use thick and thin brushes, add white to red to make tints and add black to make tones.







At Key Stage 2, we progressed to experimenting with using a number of brush techniques using thick and thin brushes to produce shapes, textures, patterns and lines and mixing colours effectively.







Upper Key Stage 2 created a colour palette based upon colours observed in the natural light and combined colours, tones and tints to enhance the piece. They also used brush techniques and the qualities of paint to create texture.







When all of these were put together, I think you will agree, the results are stunning:
