More details will be coming soon. Please do keep an eye on your email as we finalise the details and we will be seeking your agreement on a code of conduct regarding the live sessions.

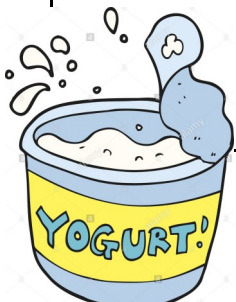
