#### Vision Screening

Parents with a child in Reception had a form sent home several weeks ago with regard to inclusion in vision screening. Parents were asked to return the form to the Child Health Department if you did not wish your child to take part. Representatives from Child Health will be visiting on Tuesday at 9am to carry out tests.

#### Behaviour

We are extremely proud of the positive ethos at Melbourne. Children are kind, considerate and mature. We strive to maintain high standards of conduct and learning behaviour as this is what makes our school such a wonderful place to learn. Naturally, children need support and guidance, and at times, need reminding of the expected standards, often at the beginning of an academic year. We have an established behaviour and rewards system that pupils all understand fully and usually strive to achieve their best. However, in the last few weeks we have had a disproportionate number of children receiving ambers or reds. Usually, children miss Golden Time on Friday afternoons as a sanction. For a small number of children, this is not proving as effective as usual and so we have decided in the short term to amend our procedure.

Children issued with an amber/red will receive a sanction on the same day. Children will be asked to stay in the hall for 5 minutes (amber) 15mins (red) at afternoon playtime. This still allows for 1 hour and 20 minutes of outdoor playtime during lunch and morning break.

It is hoped are more timely sanction will help to improve behaviours and allow Senior Staff to monitor negative behaviours. We will track this in the coming weeks and a plan will be put in place for those few children who are repeatedly not following our Behaviour Charter. Children receiving 3 or more ambers or a red in a given week will, in addition, lose 5 minutes of Golden playtime on a Friday.

We have not taken this decision lightly and we are very proud of the majority of our pupils who display excellent behaviours both in and out of school. These children will continue to be rewarded through our Dojo system. We would like to thank parents for working in partnership with us to ensure children take responsibility for their actions and enjoy a positive learning experience at school.

## <u>School Transport Reminder - Reporting Concerns</u>

Please do not hesitate to contact school if there is an issue between children on the bus. We will be happy to follow this up with you. This is the central point of contact for anyone who wishes to report an incident with Home to School transport. Only incidents reported in this way can be dealt with. Pupils, parents, bus operators and schools are able to report incidents by **completing an electronic form or telephoning 03456 445959**. This will ensure that all incidents are dealt with consistently enabling auditable, timely actions along with the facility to provide accurate feedback. Please note that children who choose to behave in an unsafe or unacceptable manner risk being refused transport by the Local Authority.
